



Letter from the President

Dear Arts Council friends and members,

t gives me great pleasure to write my first official message as President of the Howard County Arts Council (HCAC). I'm honored that the Board of Directors has selected me to lead such a vital and respected organization and I look forward to working with them in my new role.

In 2016, the Arts Council celebrated its 35th year of fostering the arts and bringing the arts to life in our community.



I'd like to take this opportunity to thank my predecessor, Mark Coates. Mark served with great dedication, care, and compassion. Among his many outstanding qualities, Mark's deep sense of responsibility and personal commitment to the arts are paramount. Having grown up in Howard County and spending 36 years of his professional life working in the county's public school system as an art teacher and Fine Arts Coordinator, Mark was involved with HCAC as an artist, educator, and a community partner since we were established 35 years ago. Throughout his tenure, Mark enthusiastically supported the Arts Council's mission and con-

stantly underscored the Howard County Center for the Arts' importance as a valuable community resource where creative ideas are incubated and where local artists and community groups develop and thrive. All of us wish Mark the best as he settles into his new home in Maine!

I would also like to acknowledge the rest of the HCAC Board, who, as dedicated volunteers, work throughout the year to support the arts. Special thanks goes to Mary Peitz, Community Liaison, Margaret Kim, AllCare of MD, and Steve Poynot, Howard Bank and HCAC's Immediate Past President, for their outstanding contributions as Board members whose terms have now come to an end.

HCAC Annual Meeting & Grant Awards Ceremony

Howard County's commitment to the arts was reflected in the wonderful turnout at the Arts Council's Annual Meeting & Grant Awards Ceremony on September 16, 2016. Nearly 250 guests were in attendance as \$559,209 in grant awards were presented by County Executive Allan Kittleman. Grants were awarded to 20 Howard County arts organizations, 14 Howard County public schools, and 12 Baltimore City arts and cultural organizations in support of general operations, artist residencies, and special projects in the arts.

HoCo Open 2017 is a non-juried exhibit open to artists (aged 18 years and older) who live, work, or study in Howard County. Local artists are invited to bring one piece of original artwork completed in the past two years to the drop-off on January 5 from 4:30–6:30pm. Artwork will be accepted for the exhibit on a first-come basis, one piece per artist, until the gallery is full. *HoCo Open* entry forms are available at hocoarts.org.

ARTsites 2017. The Arts Council is seeking proposals from artists and sites for ARTsites 2017, a one-year outdoor sculpture exhibit on display from August 2017 to July 2018. Selected artists will be awarded a grant to participate in the exhibit. Deadline to apply is February 15, 2017. Submission guidelines will be available December 15 at hocoarts.org.

Arts Scholarship. Do you know a college-bound Howard County high school senior planning on pursuing a visual arts, theatre, music, dance, or creative writing degree? Encourage them to apply for the Arts Council's Arts Scholarship program. Online applications are available at hcac.culturegrants.org. Deadline to apply is January 18, 2017.

HCAC exhibit applications are due January 1, 2017. Exhibits are selected and presented in the context of multidisciplinary, thematic, juried, and invitational exhibits. Curators and artists are encouraged to apply. Applications are available at hocoarts.org.

ManneqART. Sculptural/wearable art entries sought for the 2017

ManneqART: Sculpture on the Human Form competition featuring \$10,000 in awards to winning artists. Themes for ManneqART 2017 are Ocean, Eco, Energy, and Aviation. Early bird applications due March 31, 2017; final deadline for entries is May 15, 2017. Visit mannegart.org for details.

The Baker Artist Awards recognize artists from the Baltimore metro region who exemplify a mastery of craft, artistic excellence, and a unique and compelling vision. Artists with active Baker Artist Portfolios will automatically be submitted for award consideration on January 20, 2017. One artist per discipline will be selected to receive monetary prizes, an exhibition at the Baltimore Museum of Art, and a showcase on Maryland Public Television's *Artworks* program.
