

# Paint It! Ellicott City

## Summer Fun en Plein Air

Professional and amateur artists, easels and brushes in tow, converged on Ellicott City on a July weekend for the Arts Council's fourth annual *plein air* paint-out, presented in partnership with Howard County Tourism and Howard County Public Schools. The dozens of works created over the course of three days are a testament both to the picturesque charm of the old mill town and to the wealth of artistic talent in our region.

First popularized by the French Impressionists of the 19th century, painting *en plein air* ("in the open air") has experienced a renaissance recently, and outdoor painting events like *Paint It!* draw increasing numbers of participants and spectators each year.

*Paint It!* began with an Artist & VIP Welcome Reception on Thursday, July 11 at the Howard County Welcome Center, featuring a presentation by *Paint It!* juror Mark Karnes, Painting Professor at Maryland Institute College of Art. Among the attendees were representatives from the boards of Howard County Tourism, Howard County Economic Development Authority, Howard County Chamber of Commerce, and the Arts Council.

Undeterred by rain and heat, 25 juried artists set up easels and worked industriously for the next three days, capturing the unique architecture and bohemian appeal of Ellicott City's historic district. The juried artists were joined by 33 community painters who worked alongside them as Open Paint-Out participants. Ellicott City visitors and locals alike gathered to watch the artists at work, lending the event a festive atmosphere. A preview at Ellicott City's Second Sunday Market gave the public a closer look at some of the finished work. On Monday, July 15, staff and

volunteers hung the artists' work at the Howard County Center for the Arts. Work from the open paint-out was displayed in the Center's lobby that evening, then moved to the Howard County Welcome Center, where it will be on display through Labor Day.

At the Center reception, 280 guests were on hand as \$5,100 in awards was presented.

Mark Karnes selected works by ten artists for Juror's Choice awards: Bruno Baran, Joanna Barnum, Mark Coates, Catherine Hillis, Greg Johannesen,

Janice Kirsh, Alison Menke, Duane Sabiston, Steve Stannard, and Lida Stifel. The new Gino Award, a purchase award in honor of Ellicott City artist Gino Manelli (1915–2010), was presented by Gino's son Julian to Olga Bolgar, Greg Johannesen, Kathleen Gilbert Kotarba, and Debra Moffitt. Ann Crostic received

Howard County Blossoms of Hope's award for Best Depiction of Nature, while the Best Urban Scene Award, presented by Steve Stannard, Julie Hunko, and Salient Group, went to Bruno Baran and Janice Kirsh. The Howard County Tourism Director's Choice Award was presented to Leah Lewman. The Arts Council Director's Choice Award went to Maria Marino.

We'd like to thank all the Ellicott City businesses and volunteers that supported the artists during *Paint It!*, the community members who came out to watch, and especially all the artists who participated.
