Artists Turn Out to Paint It!

A sunny summer weekend in July was the perfect backdrop for *Paint It! Ellicott City*, the Arts Council's fifth annual *plein air* paint-out, presented in partnership with Howard County Tourism and Howard County Public Schools. Twenty-seven juried artists as well as dozens of community painters gathered in Ellicott City's historic district July 11–13 to take part in the popular event.

Paint It! began with an Artist & VIP Welcome Reception on Thursday, July 10 at the Howard County Welcome Center, featuring a presentation by Paint It! juror

ing a presentation by *Paint It!* juror
Michael Bare, Baltimore landscape and plein air painter and teacher.

Over the following three days, the juried artists and community painters interpreted the 'sense of place' so unique to Ellicott City—drawing inspiration from the old mill town's quirky architecture, steep hillsides, and historic landmarks.

On Monday, July 14, a reception was held at the Howard County Center for the Arts for the juried artists' *Paint It!* exhibition. Work from the Open Paint-Out was displayed in the Center's lobby that evening then moved to Howard County Welcome Center, where it remained on display throughout

the summer. At the reception, 140 guests were on hand as more than \$6,000 in awards was presented to the artists. Director's Choice Awards were presented to Sharon Trumbull and the artist Noble. Steve Stannard received the Blossoms of Hope award for Best Depiction of Nature, while the Salient Group's Best Urban Scene Award went to David

Diaz. The Gino Award, named in honor of Ellicott City artist Gino Manelli (1915–2010), was presented by juror Michael Bare to two artists, Mark Coates and Michael Kotarba. Bare also presented Honorable Mention Awards to the following artists: Jaye Ayres, Bruno Baran, David Diaz, Greg Johannesen, Janice Kirsh, Heather Leatherman, Maria Marino, and Duane Sabiston.

We'd like to thank all the Ellicott City businesses and the many volunteers that supported the artists during *Paint It!*, the community members who came out to watch, and especially all the artists who participated. HCAC's Annual Meeting and Grant Awards Ceremony

he Arts Council will host its Annual Meeting and FY2015 Grant Awards Ceremony on September 12, 2014 from 6–8 p.m. Opening remarks by Arts Council President Steve Poynot will be followed by the presentation of grant awards by Howard County Executive Ken Ulman (invited). About the value of the arts, County Executive Ulman said:

"Howard County is a thriving place with an enviable quality of life, and our vibrant arts community is an integral part of what makes living, working and playing here so special.

Over the past eight years, as your County Executive, I have done all I can to support the arts in Howard County—in all their forms.

One of the true joys of my day is walking into my office, where our walls are lined with vibrant and inspiring artwork from public school students, so many of whom receive training and guidance from the terrific programs run by the Arts Council at the Howard County Center for the Arts in Ellicott City.

My mother, Diana, a talented artist, instilled in her family an appreciation of design and color that fills our lives and our homes. Arts have enriched the lives of my daughters, Maddie and Lily, budding performers who love to dance, sing and create.

So I'd like to take a moment to let you know that this year's Howard County budget contains record funding for the Arts Council, with \$1 million available for important programming. And because of smart management, we had additional resources so we could provide an extra \$250,000 in one-time arts grants, and \$200,000 for a new Arts Entrepreneurism Incubator program, which will bring even more work into the community.

We are working hard to make sure arts and culture are a central part of many of our neighborhoods. The Downtown Columbia Arts and Culture Commission will continue its work creating a vibrant cultural district with a renovated Merriweather Post Pavilion at its center. The exciting Inner Arbor project is also receiving our support.

We continue exploring plans to expand the reach of the Howard County Center for the Arts and make sure as many people as possible gain exposure to artists and their work.

I want to take a moment to express my thanks to Coleen West, the executive director of the Howard County Arts Council, the Arts Council board and all the artists and patrons who contribute their time and energy in pursuit of their passions.

Our community will benefit from your interest and participation, and from the investments we are making. Together, we will ensure that the arts remain at the center of life in Howard County, an inviting place to think, grow and express ourselves in new ways."

Local and state public officials as well as leaders in the arts will be on hand September 12 to recognize and celebrate Howard County's arts community. A free reception will follow the grant awards presentation. ★
