1) ELEMENTS • Jeff Chyatte

Howard County Library System, Glenwood Branch Powder-coated aluminum; $6^{2} \times 54^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{5} 4^{\prime \prime}$
Fusing math

## The Arc of Howard County

Stucco, concrete, steel; $6^{\prime} \times 6^{\prime} \times 12$
Popsicles is a stone carving by sculptor Craig Gray, whose work is often inspired by his studiol location in Key West, Florida. Like Gray's other work in this year's ARTsites extibit, Slices of Heaven, this piece creates a sense of tension by placing larger-than-life objects
into a whimsical stack.

A light cone is the path that a flash of light, emanating from a single event and traveling in all directions, would take through space-time. This sclupture depicts that path, break
white light into the three primary colors.

## CRESCENT • Steven Durow

Howard County Government, George Howard Building Cast recycled glass, steel, light; $7 \times 66^{\prime} \times 2^{\prime}$
Inspired by Durow's experiences in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina and participating in the rebuiliding of New Orleans, Crescent is mace as an adc, which it manemialics indicaess the movement people of New Orleans slowly rebuilt their lives long after the media and national attention faded over the horizon. Using cast glass elements the work reflects, redirects, and absorbs the sun during the day, giving Crescent a dynamic and changing character. At inght the work is liff from within, emititing a quiet but powerful presence.
5 RYBEE HOUSE II • Stephen KIema
Howard County Center for the Arts
Stained \& painted wood; $5^{\prime} \times 10^{\prime} \times 5^{\prime}$
Rybee House II is a roofed sculpural bench design incorporating Rybee House ins a roofed sculpurara bench design incorporating overapping and interlocking visual interpretations of trees and
architectural structures. It moves between the natural and the urban incorporating a sense of whimsy and fantasy. The bench on one side provides a resting place in nature, while the doorways and corners on the other faces of the structure represent transition and change paths of entry and emergence into a more urban evocation.
6 YELLOW CLOWN • David Friedheim
AIDA Bistro, Corporate Office Properties Trust
Painted steel; $7 \times 7{ }^{\prime} \times 1{ }^{\prime}$
Yellow Clown is a figurative painted steel sculpture composed of small steel plates welded together to form a large figure. Like Blue of sculptures created as examples of dififerent sculptural metal techniques.

7 SLICES OF HEAVEN • Craíg Gray
North Laurel Community Center \& Park
Recycled concrete \& limestone; $4^{\prime} \times 4^{4} \times 12^{\prime}$
Slicec of Heaven is
Slices of Heaven is a stone carving by sculptor Craig Gray, whose work is often inspired by his studio location in Key West, Florida.
Though the work is made of heavy stone, the stacked orange slices seem to teeter precariously. This work exemplifies his goal to combine imagination and fun.

## (8) BIRDZELS • Mark Chatterley

James \& Anne Robinson Nature Center High-fired clay; each sculpture 6 ${ }^{6}-7$ ' high
Chatterey's work explores the idea of finding beauty in the malformed and acceptance of the inevitable. He is interested in representing the ever-changing nature of the world, and reconciling
the inevitability of decay that is present with every form of fife.

## (9) CELESTIAL TRACE • GIenn Zweygardt

## Howard County General Hospital

Verde antique, cast glass, stainless steel, bronze; $7^{7} 10^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime} \times 2^{\prime}$ Celestial Trace is sculpted in verde antique, a metamorphic stone from Vermont. This stone is one of Zweygard's favorites - originally a white stone with a green vein, it underwent a metamorphic transformation to become the dark green stone that makes up the body of the sculpture. The stone body is studded with insets of cast glass to suggest constellations and the brilliance and intrigue of the night sky.

## Horowitz Visual \& Performing Arts Center

## Stainless steel; $1^{\prime} \times 7 \times{ }^{\prime} \times 6^{\prime}$

Blue Planet is a kinetic scupture. The stainless steel top and blue sphere create a rhythmic motion and balance, representing the movement of the wind, elements and invisible force. This sculpture depicts celestial movement in nature; the circular forms can be interpreeted as cosmic space, while the vertical and horizontal lines represent comets, gases, clouds, and heavenly objects.

## (11) CELEBRATION OF FLIGHT • Carl Billingsley

## Columbia Association, Slayton House

Painted aluminum; $1^{\prime} \times 55^{\prime} \times 11^{\prime}$
Painted aluminum; '1x 5 'x11'
Celebration of Flight, like many of Billingsley's sculptures, is a reflection on way-find ing, discoverry, and the evolution of modern eifieciion on way--inding, discoverr, and the evolution of modem
civilizaion. His work often references history and technological processes; by leaving evidence of the sculpture's creation (with mold lines, chisel marks, or other visual markers), he leaves a physical reminder of the history of the worki itself.

2 TwISted botanical wave • Mary Angers Howard County Library System, Central Branch Painted aluminum; $6^{\prime} \times 3^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$
Twisted Botanical Wave is an exploration of coordinate space geometry, representing the idea of $X, Y$, and $Z$ axes in a three-
dimensional object. The rippling patterns on the surface of the piece also reflect Angers' interest in the scientific formation of waves.


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
