eptember marked my fourth year of service on the Arts Council Board of Directors. This experience has been rewarding in so many ways. Among the experiences I've enjoyed most is working with a dedicated group of trustees, volunteers, and staff who work behind the scenes to make the arts in Howard County come alive! So, it is with great pleasure that I welcome three newly elected members to the Arts Council Board: David Kay, M&T Bank; Greg Lowe, Lowe Wealth Advisors; and

In June, I took over the position of Board President (one year early) as my predecessor, Buzz Bartlett, moved out of the region. I worked closely with Buzz over the years and greatly admired his thoughtful leadership style. The community relations and fundraising expertise he brought to us from his former positions as Director of Corporate Affairs at Lockheed Martin and Director of Corporate and Foundation Relations at the University of Maryland helped guide our strategic discussions and was invaluable to the capital campaign feasibility study we led in 2017. In addition, Buzz is a gifted visual artist and writer. During his tenure he frequently spoke about the virtues of the Howard County Center for the Arts—often reminding the Board and others about the importance of the center as a home for artists, a gathering place to connect people with the arts, a space for life-long learning, and an incubator for creativity. All of us wish Marylen and Buzz the best as they settle into their new West Coast home!

The Arts Council has had both a rousing and resourceful year. I am particularly proud of our efforts to support the Ellicott City artists whose livelihoods were threatened as a result of the flash flood last summer. With the help of over 100 donors, we established the Re-CREATE: Ellicott City Artist Relief Fund and awarded 34 grants to support affected artists and help re-establish the vibrant arts district in Historic Ellicott City.

I am also inspired by our stunning new website. The site features a comprehensive resource section and a county-wide online arts calendar, an amazingly powerful tool for promotion of the arts in our greater community. The calendar, a free service for artists, arts groups and audiences, provides a platform to highlight all arts and cultural events occurring at venues county-wide, keeping both the arts community and audiences informed.

In addition, a sub-committee of the Arts Council Board continued to work with the Howard County Housing Commission, Orchard Development, and Toby and Hal Orenstein on the concept of a combined cultural arts center and residential project in Downtown Columbia. We've had many conversations with artists and community leaders about the need for a state-of-the-art arts center to better serve our community and provide

Our Annual Meeting & Grant Awards Ceremony on September 15th was a time to reflect on the past year's accomplishments and to look forward to a new year fostering Howard County's artists and arts organizations. Nearly 180 guests were in attendance as \$583,593 in grant awards were presented by County Executive Allan Kittleman. Grants were awarded to 22 Howard County arts organizations, 14 Howard County public schools, and 11 Baltimore City arts and cultural organizations in support of general operations, artist residencies, and special projects in the arts.


