HCAC GENERAL EXHIBIT PROGRAM Visual artists and curators — are you looking for a place to exhibit your work? We are seeking artwork in all mediums to include in upcoming exhibits. Individual artists, as well as curators and arts groups interested in presenting a group show, are encouraged to apply. Exhibits are selected and presented in the context of multi-disciplinary, thematic, juried, and invitational exhibits. Applications are due October 1. Details and application information are available in the Exhibit Opportunities section at hocoarts.org.

HOCO OPEN is a non-juried exhibit open to artists (aged 18 years and older) who live, work, or study in Howard County. Eligible artists are invited to submit one piece of ready-to-hang original artwork completed in the past two years for inclusion in the exhibit, which will run from December 16 to February 4. Artwork submissions will be accepted online on a first-come basis, one piece per artist, until 100 submissions have been received. A highlight of HoCo Open will be the presentation of the \$500 Covington Emerging Artist Award, established by local gallery owner Robin Holliday to recognize and support an emerging artist at a pivotal time in their career. 

Presented in partnership with EC250 Inc. and the Howard County Historical Society, *EC250: ARTifacts* is a commemorative group exhibit celebrating 250

years of Ellicott City by showcasing 18 local artists' responses to objects from the artifact collection of the Howard County Historical Society. Among the historical items selected as inspiration by the artists are a compass purportedly used by Andrew Ellicott during surveys in the late 1700s and a keepsake box containing a lock of hair. Featured works comprise a variety of media, including oil, mosaic, installation, photography, glass, hand-cut paper, spoken word, and more.



Branching Out is a multi-media exhibit featuring tapestries by Jenn Cacciola, of Stanford, Connecticut, and found wood sculptures by George Lorio, of Rockville, Maryland. 
