Dear Arts Council Members and Friends,

As we come to the close of 2022, it is time to both reflect and look ahead. My first term as president flew by. We had a creative and productive year.

In March, I attended The Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and HCPSS High School Gifted and Talented Side-by-Side Concert, which was funded in part through a grant from the Arts Council. During the concert, I was invited to sit on the Meyerhoff stage with my family and other Howard County parents and enjoy a wonderful night of performances with Howard County students playing alongside professional BSO musicians.

In June, we presented the free, family-friendly ARTreach Festival at Long Reach Village Center, where over 2,000 community members enjoyed a day of world music and made memories through make-and-take activities including caricatures, pinata-making, tie-dying T-shirts, and so much more.

In October, our long-time executive director, Coleen West, marked 25 years at the Arts Council. When asked how we should recognize this occasion, she replied, "Let's 'pay it forward." We presented Gino Molfino with the 2022 Coleen West Leadership in the Arts Award at our Celebration of the Arts gala for his dedication to and advancement of the arts in our community. Gino is an outstanding leader, who has received both state and national arts education awards for his commitment to excellence, his development and oversight of arts curriculum, and his impact on and thoughtful support of HCPSS fine arts teachers and students countywide. Recognition from the local arts community and the Arts Council was overdue.

Looking ahead, the focus of my next term as president will be to work with the Board to develop the Arts Council's strategic plan for FY2024-2029. During this process, we will re-examine our existing mission, vision, core values, and strategic goals through the lens of diversity, equity, and inclusion, with the goal of creating a strategic plan centered on equity that will guide policy and programming efforts. We secured grants from the Horizon Foundation, the Maryland State Arts Council, and the Community Foundation of Howard County to support our

Preliminary work on the plan began last spring as Joseph W. Ritsch, producing artistic director for Rep Stage, led discussions with our Board about the theatre company's journey to create a non-racist theatre. This work continued in the fall with interviews and focus groups led by national consulting firm The Sort Sol Group, who was hired to guide the Board's strategic planning process. The Board also took a full-day bus trip to two local arts councils. We toured their

BAKER ARTIST AWARDS recognizes artists from the Baltimore metro region who exemplify a mastery of craft, depth of artistic exploration, and a unique vision. In 2023, one artist in each of the six artistic disciplines – Visual Arts, Film/ Video, Interdisciplinary, Literary Arts, Performance, and Music – will be awarded the \$10,000 Mary Sawyers Baker Prize. One of these six artists will also be selected to receive the \$30,000 Mary Sawyers Imboden prize. All artists who have an active portfolio on the Baker website on Tuesday, January 17, 2023 at 5:00pm will be considered for one of this year's six awards. It was a pleasure to welcome so many artists and arts supporters to our Annual Meeting & Grant Awards Ceremony on September 16th. More than 100 guests were on hand as we reflected on the past year's achievements and looked forward to another year supporting local community artists and arts organizations. For Fiscal Year 2023, \$639,200 in grants were presented to 24 Howard County organizations, 11 Howard County public schools, and 12 Baltimore City arts and cultural organizations in support of general operations, artist residencies, and special projects in the arts.
