I am writing to nominate Brenda Kidera for the Howie Award for Outstanding Artist.

As one who has attended the Howard County Celebration of the Arts Gala for a number of years and who has admired the extremely talented individuals who have received the Howies, I know that those awards always go to people who are technical masters of their means of expression, who are passionate about and dedicated to their craft, and who have had broad and deep impact in our community and beyond.

Brenda Kidera, an exceptionally talented contemporary realist painter who has lived in Howard County since age 6 and is thus a true product of Howard County, perfectly embodies every one of these qualities and is most deserving of the Howie Award for Outstanding Artist.

With regard to her technical skills, Brenda is truly a master. Whether working in oil, acrylics, or water color, Brenda's mastery of technique shines through. Among many other works, "Pink Fluff," a study in pink and red featuring a flock of Roseate Spoonbills, demonstrates her exquisite knowledge and use of color (see the painting and hear her descriptions [here](#)¹). Her "Tranquility" is just one example of her ability to capture the subtleties of light and shadow, which, of course, are all-important to a visual artist (see the painting and hear her description [here](#)²). Her keen eye for composition and the amount of thought and planning she puts into that aspect of her art—whether in a landscape, a portrait, or a painting of animals—is abundantly clear in every one of her works (her comments on "Tranquility" also deal give insight into her expertise in composition).

One would think that the skills of an artist as talented as Brenda would have been recognized far and wide—and indeed they have been. Her work has been selected to appear in a great many shows. She has participated in a total of well over 100 shows; and, so far in 2017 alone, she has participated in 17 shows in Maryland, Virginia, Delaware, Pennsylvania, and Ohio, including shows of the Washington Society of Landscape Painters, the Baltimore Watercolor Society's Mid-Atlantic Exhibition, and the Oil Painters of America 26th Annual Nation Exhibition in Cincinnati. Simply having been chosen to have works in all these shows is a tribute to her expert skills.

Brenda has won many specific awards for her art work. In addition to her Best-in-Show Award for the Plein Air Paintout in Frederick in June, 2017, she won the M. Graham Award in 2016, and in 2013 she won the Canson-Arches Award at the Baltimore Watercolor Society's Mid-Atlantic Exhibit. In 2010, Brenda won the People's Choice Award and Second Place at the Washington Society of Landscape Painters Exhibit, and honorable Mention at the Baltimore

Watercolor Society's 125th Anniversary Exhibit. Numerous other awards are listed in her resume.

Further proof of Brenda's mastery of her craft can be seen in her having been selected as a juried signature member of these organizations: the Washington Society of Landscape Painters (of which she has been a Board member); the Baltimore Watercolor Society (of which she has served on Board of Governors), of Animal Artists, and of Potomac Valley Watercolorists. Further recognitions of her talent and accomplishments are shown in the fact that she has been asked to serve as a juror for the Baltimore Watercolor Society, the Delaware Watercolor Society, and other regional exhibits. Only the best of the best are invited to participate in these ways.

In addition to exhibiting her consummate technical skills, Brenda's paintings also radiate the passion and dedication she brings to her art. The spirit and personality of each of her portraits subjects fairly jump off the canvas, and her landscapes and paintings of flora and fauna at once capture both the simplicity and the complexity of nature with all its nuances. One cannot help but marvel at the love of people and nature that shines through and permeates her work. But the enchantment created by her paintings is deceptively simple as it hides the tremendous hard work and dedication through which she creates each piece of art.

A further demonstration of Brenda's passion and dedication to art lies in her constant striving to further her craft. After early studies and her graduation with honors from Towson University, she then studied both art and architecture in Florence, Italy. Now, although already at the very top of her profession, she continues private instruction with master artist David Zuccarini, and she still seeks various avenues to expand and broaden her skills by attending workshops with nationally recognized artists, such as Martha Mans, Linda Moyer, Joe Fettingis, Nicholas Simmons, Louis Escobedo, Paul Jackson, and Linda Baker.

Her reasons for pursuing these additional avenues of study are not for herself alone: a warm and inspiring teacher, Brenda has for 20 years openly and actively shared her knowledge and expertise in our community and beyond. She regularly teaches classes for children, teens, and adults at her own studio and through such organizations as Howard County Recreation and Parks, the Columbia Arts Center, and the Art League of Ocean City. In addition, she has a remarkable record of teaching workshops for local and regional organizations, including the Washington Society of Landscape Painters, the Laurel Art Guild, the Baltimore Watercolor Society, and the Delaware Watercolor Society, among others. Her series of youtube.com videos is yet another way in which Brenda eagerly and expertly shares her knowledge far beyond her community. One of the hallmarks of a truly outstanding artist is the ability to inspire others to find their own talents and develop their own skills. Through her teaching and other outreach, Brenda has done—and continues to do—just that to a remarkable degree.

In summary, Brenda Kidera is richly deserving of the Howie Award for Outstanding Artist because her expertise, accomplishments, and dedication to her craft mark her as a truly exceptional artist, one who has not only reached the pinnacle of her own success, but who also makes impressive contributions to the arts in Howard County and beyond.

Brenda Kidera is a classical realist artist. Her paintings reflect a deep appreciation for the beauty of nature. Kidera captures moments in time with brushstrokes that convey the light and mood and exquisite details of her subject matter. The subjects of her paintings vary, including landscape, wildlife, portrait, still life and floral. Her work has won many awards and has been exhibited throughout the US, including one-woman shows and major art exhibitions. Kidera has been teaching painting in watercolor, oil and acrylic since the 1990's. She is currently working on a series of instructional videos.

Beyond a fine art degree, Kidera studied classical oil painting

and has attended workshops with several nationally recognized artists. Her work has been featured in many publications. Juried signature artist memberships include the Baltimore Watercolor Society, Washington Society of Landscape Painters, Society of Animal Artists, and Potomac Valley Watercolorists. For many years, she has taught painting classes and workshops and continues to paint commissioned portraits, landscapes and other subjects for a wide range of clients.

Kidera's studio is located in Woodbine, Maryland surrounded by gardens and wildlife which are inspiration for many of her paintings. Kidera lives with her husband, metal sculptor Ed Kidera.

Artist couple will have chance to shine at show

Woodbine residents are selected to be part of Bethesda Row Arts Festival

She paints. He makes things out of metal.

At their home in Woodbine, Ed and Brenda Kidera each have their own studio — hers is in the house, while his is in a building he built himself a short distance from the house.

"From the beginning, we've always worked at home," Brenda said. "It's nice."

While they both work at home, they don't work together.

"We both do very different things," Ed said. "We don't really collaborate on anything."

"We tend to meet for lunch," Brenda added.

The artists will be doing a show together as both Brenda and Ed were selected to be part of the Bethesda Row Arts Festival on Oct. 14 and 15. They are the only artists from Maryland of the 190 selected to be in the show.

"It is high-end art," said Brenda, who attended the show with a friend five years ago. "I saw a lot of artists I knew."

"It's pretty competitive," Ed said, adding thousands of artists apply for entry to the show.

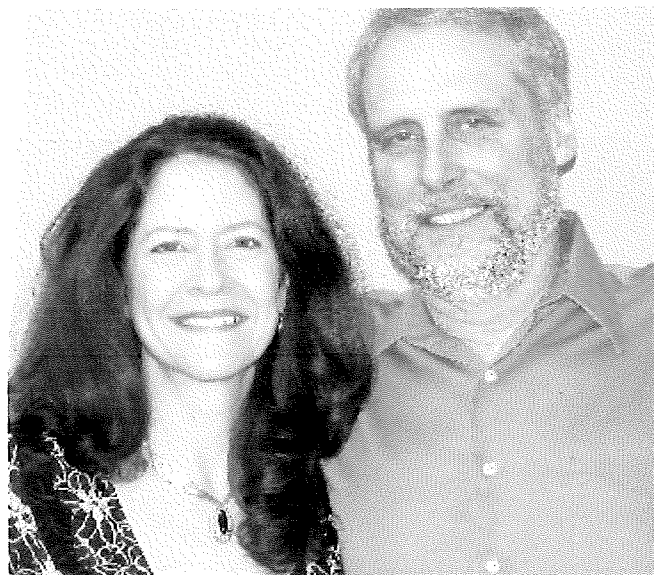
The Kideras are no strangers to art shows. Both travel to numerous shows on their own, and occasionally, together. Their two daughters, now adults, were raised at art shows, Brenda joked.

"We do different types of shows," Ed explained. "Some are only crafts, some are fine arts, some art. Bethesda is a mix of fine art and fine crafts."

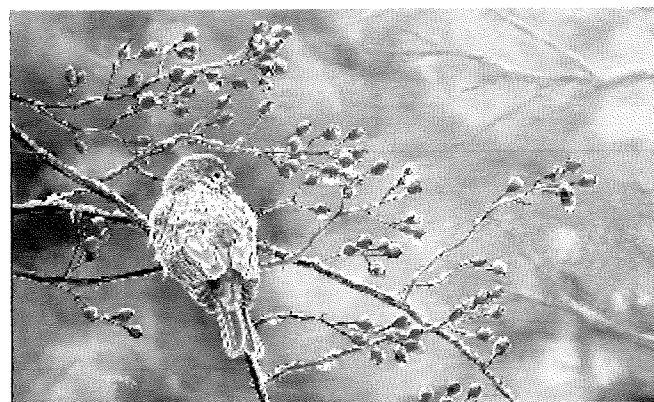
While Brenda's paintings — whether in oil, water or acrylics — are typically classified as fine art, Ed's metal pieces are harder to classify. Some shows see his metal bells and air ships as crafts, other as metal fine art.

Ed tends to travel more and further for shows, going to the Mid-West as well as the East Coast. Brenda does shows closer to home. She also teaches painting classes.

When they are able to do a show together, they request booths next to each other. They pack up their vans with their work, tables, tents — whatever they need to create their booths at a show. Some

Brenda Kidera, "Winter Visitor," oil

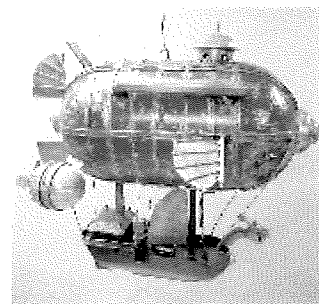
shows require them to set up at 3:30 a.m.

"It's a lot of work," Brenda admitted.

At the end of the day on weekend events, they just close their tent flaps.

"You hope nothing happens," Ed said. "Both of us have stuff that you can't put in a pocket and walk away with."

Both also have pieces in local galleries,

including HorseSpirit Arts Gallery on Main Street in historic Ellicott City, where each had pieces affected by the flood in July 2016.

"Her use of light and detail is just magnificent," said Robin Holliday, owner of HorseSpirit. "People just love her work. She has a following here."

Ed's pieces, Holliday said, reflect his background in engineering with their moving parts.

"He is just so creative," Holliday said. "I can't believe what he comes up with."

Brenda finds inspiration for her work looking out her studio's windows or walking through the gardens she and Ed created — one thing they do together.

"We're both avid gardeners," Brenda said, though not of vegetables.

"We're just terrible at growing anything to eat," Ed said. "We have lots of flowers and plants."

While Brenda has no intention of ever retiring, Ed realizes he may not always be able to physically do his work.

"When I started making pieces, I said that after I made 10,000 pieces that I would quit," he said. "I have made 8,150 and I started in 1991."

For now, both plan to continue working from their home studios in Woodbine.

"It is wonderful to know someone else appreciates your work," Ed said. "I like making the stuff."

"There are pieces I hold on to a long, long time," Brenda admitted. "But I'll basically sell anything unless the girls are in it. It's a living."

The Bethesda Row Arts Festival will take place Oct. 14-15, at Woodmont and Bethesda avenues, Elm Street and Bethesda Lane. Admission is free.
