HCAC GENERAL EXHIBIT PROGRAM Visual artists and curators — are you looking for a place to exhibit your work? We are seeking artwork in all mediums to include in upcoming exhibits. Individual artists, as well as curators and arts groups interested in presenting a group show, are encouraged to apply. Exhibits are selected and presented in the context of multi-disciplinary, thematic, juried, and invitational exhibits. Applications are due October 1. Details and application information are available in the Exhibit Opportunities section at hocoarts.org.

HOCO OPEN is a non-juried exhibit open to artists (aged 18 years and older) who live, work, or study in Howard County. Eligible artists are invited to submit one piece of ready-to-hang original artwork completed in the past two years for inclusion in the exhibit, which will run from December 15 to February 3. Artwork submissions will be accepted online on a first-come basis, one piece per artist, until 100 submissions have been received. ARTS SCHOLARSHIP Planning to pursue a degree in the arts? Paint It! Ellicott City 2023

It was mostly beautiful weather for our annual plein air paint-out June 8-11 as 27 juried artists and more than 40 community painters gathered in historic Ellicott City's historic district to paint the town.

The Arts Council hosted a public reception on June 12 for the opening of the exhibit showcasing the work of 27 juried artists and featured the presentation of more than \$8,000 in artist awards by juror Doris Glovier. Top Prize of the evening are the Gino Awards, \$1,000 each, sponsored by the Manelli Family and named in honor of Ellicott City artist Gino Manelli (1915-2010).
