Ellicott City 2023 Plein Air Paint-Out

Paint It! Ellicott City 2023 is an annual event that brings artists and spectators interested in the plein air tradition to Historic Ellicott City. To paint 'en plein air' is the act of painting outside, on location, and often in the public view.

Over the course of the weekend, juried artists set up their easels throughout Ellicott City's historic district and 'paint the town' as they vie for up to \$10,000 in awards including the coveted \$1,000 Gino Awards. Community artists are invited to join the fun as part of the Open Paint-Out, which takes place concurrently.

On June 12, HCAC will host a free public reception from 6-8pm to celebrate the opening of an exhibit of the juried artists' work at the Howard County Center for the Arts. A highlight of the reception will be the presentation of juror awards. Paint It! Ellicott City 2023 will be on display from June 13 through August 5. Artists and visitors may view and purchase the finished pieces during the reception.

An exhibit of work created by Open Paint-Out artists will be on view June 15 through August 20 at Visit Howard County with a reception to take place on June 20.



Paint It! Ellicott City 2023 showcases artwork created by juried artists during our annual plein air paint-out in Ellicott City's historic district. The juror for this year's exhibit is Doris Glovier, who will offer remarks and present juror awards at the reception on June 12

Isolation within proximity to one another is a major theme explored by all artists in our upcoming three-person June exhibit. Danielle Klebes' paintings explore the feeling of seclusion, despite the subjects being surrounded by others. Matthew Terry's conceptual photographs explore a level of detachment subtle enough for most people to connect with. Margaret Wiss'

photographs capture the loneliness that came with COVID, finding yourself, and the possibilities that come with that self-exploration. Together, the works create a theme of internalized reflection and self-realization, two subjects many of us have dealt with in during COVID and the years following.

A Fond Farewell to a longtime Resident Studio Artist

James Adkins is a contemporary realist painter whose work focuses on the human figure. Jim's residency at the Howard County Center for the Arts, which will soon be ending, began in 1984. A lifelong teacher, he taught locally at both Mt. Hebron and Howard High Schools before spending nearly 30 years as a professor at Howard Community College, holding the position of Director of Visual Arts and serving as the first Gallery Director of The Rouse Company Foundation Gallery. Jim's natural teaching ability led him to establish weekly drop-in drawing and painting model sessions at the Center which are still ongoing today. His teaching skills also helped him guide and inspire many of our Resident Studio Artists and instill a sense of curiosity, collaboration, and comradery among the artists in our community. We wish Jim the best; he will most certainly be missed.
