

HCAC Gallery Exhibit Program. Visual artists and curators—are you looking for a place to exhibit your work? We are seeking artwork in all mediums to include in upcoming exhibits. Individual artists, as well as curators and arts groups interested in presenting a group show, are encouraged to apply. Exhibits are selected and presented in the context of multi-disciplinary, thematic, juried, and invitational exhibits. Applications are due **October 1**. Details and application information are available in the Exhibit Opportunities section at **hocoarts.org**.

Arts Scholarship. Is an arts degree in your future? The Arts Council invites college-bound Howard County high school seniors pursuing higher education in any arts discipline—visual arts, theatre, music, dance, or creative writing—to apply for its arts scholarship program. Applications are available **October 1** at **hcac.gosmart.org**. Deadline to apply is **January 28, 2022**.

Holiday Maker-Mart. We're currently seeking vendors for this fun and festive event, to be held on Thursday, December 2 from 5:30-8:30 pm. This year, select wares from Maker-Mart artists will also be featured for show and sale in our galleries for two weeks. If you're an artist or artisan with handmade, original art and craft items to sell, visit **hocoarts.org/makermartartists** to learn more. We will begin accepting applications on **September 1**—available space is limited, so don't delay!

HoCo Open is a non-juried exhibit open to artists (aged 18 years and older) who live, work, or study in Howard County. Eligible artists are invited to submit one piece of ready-to-hang original artwork completed in the past two years for inclusion in the exhibit, which will run from December 18 to February 5. Artwork submissions will be accepted online on a first-come basis, one piece per artist, until 100 submissions have been received. A highlight of *HoCo Open* will be the presentation of the \$500 Covington Emerging Artist Award, established by local gallery owner Robin Holliday to recognize and support an emerging artist at a pivotal time in their career. Regeneration features large-scale mixed-media sculptures and installations by Marcia Wolfson Ray and Micaela de Vivero. Ray collects wood from local environments to explore concepts of regeneration and the ways in which humans are connected, while de Vivero uses soft, malleable, and porous materials to create installations investigating the relationship between viewers and space.

Resiliencia showcases works by Julia Justo, Dulce Pinzón, and Christine Sloan Stoddard. These artists use interdisciplinary methods to explore social and political concepts through photography, mixed-media, and film.

A reception for both exhibits will be held on September 17 from 6-8pm as part of Road to the Arts weekend.

Discover Howard County's eclectic visual arts scene during Road to the Arts weekend,


