

The event will feature up to 40 local artists and artisans, live music, a reception, Resident Artist open studios (6-8pm), and the juried Holiday Maker Mart. Applications for the one-night event accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

HCAC GENERAL EXHIBIT PROGRAM Visual artists and curators—are you looking for a place to exhibit your work? We are seeking artwork in all mediums to include in upcoming exhibits. Individual artists, curators, and arts groups interested in presenting a group show are encouraged to apply. Exhibits are selected and presented in the context of multi-disciplinary, thematic, juried, and invitational exhibits. Applications are due October 1. Details and application information are available in the Exhibit Opportunities section at hocoarts.org.

HOCO OPEN 2025 is a non-juried exhibit open to artists (aged 18 years and older) who live, work, or study in Howard County. Eligible artists are invited to submit one piece of ready-to-hang original artwork completed in the past two years for inclusion in the exhibit, which will run from December 13 to February 1. Artwork submissions will be accepted online on a first-come basis, one piece per artist, until 100 submissions have been received. The weather was gorgeous for our annual plein air paint-out June 6-9 as juried artists and more than 50 community painters gathered in historic Ellicott City's historic district to paint the town.

The Arts Council hosted a public reception on June 10 for the exhibit's opening, featuring the work of juried artists and the presentation of over \$7,500 in artist awards by juror Abigail McBride. Top prizes of the evening were the two Gino Awards, \$1,000 each, sponsored by the Manelli Family and named in honor of Ellicott City artist Gino Manelli (1915-2010). This year, the awards were presented to Christopher Best for *Morning on the Line*, and Pamela J. Betts for *A Cascade of Light on the Patapsco*. An opening reception for an exhibit featuring artists who took part in the Open Paint portion of Paint It! Ellicott City was held on June 27 at the Howard County Welcome Center.
